

# HISTORIC HINMAN ROAD



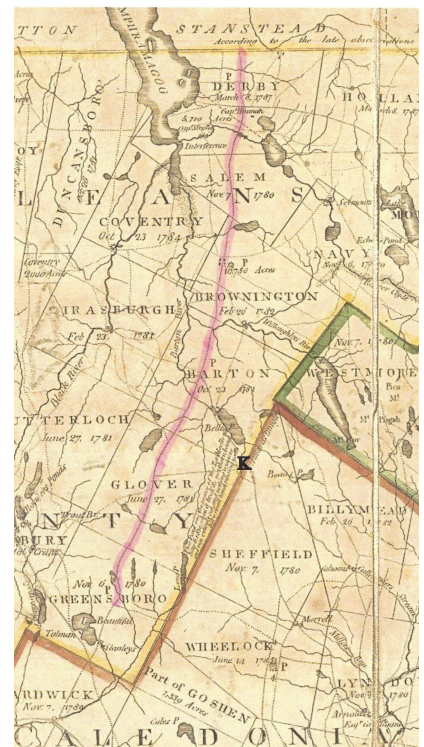
Timothy Hinman was born in 1760 in Woodbury, CT. He fought in the Revolutionary War in the CT division. He moved to Derby, VT in about 1800 and lived there until his death in 1850 at age 90.

The **Hinman Road**, which was called the County Road, was built by Timothy Hinman between 1791 and 1797. He started at the **Bailey Hazen Road** in Greensboro and headed northeast to Derby, where he owned land by Derby Pond, and then later he continued the road into Canada.

The Hinman Road was the first road built

through Orleans County. Early settlers followed the road north and built their settlements along it, including the **Parker Settlement** in Glover, Brownington Village, and Derby Village.

At one point the Hinman Road was part of the stage route between Boston and Montreal.
